Goal: The goal of all classes is to introduce Chinese language by integrating the "5Cs" principles of the National Standards for Foreign Language Education—Communication, Cultures, Comparisons, Connections, and Communities.

Adult Chinese Language Conversation Classes

Beginner level: Basic Chinese Conversations

Basic adult Chinese language course is designed to provide adult students the opportunity to learn Chinese language. Adult learners must be over 18 years old and never have Chinese learning experiences before. In this class, the students will learn traditional and simplified characters as well as understand how to use Zhuyin/Pinyin phonetic system to pronounce. The objective of this class is to help adults learn to improve their listening and speaking abilities by using theme-based and daily life situational conversations. They will also learn to understand Chinese culture. They will be able to identify basic sentence structures and practice conversations. Textbook and handouts will be used in the class.

Intermediate level: Fundamental Chinese Conversations

Fundamental adult Chinese language course is designed to have adult learners who speak simple Chinese and recognize some Chinese words. The objective of this course is to further the beginner courses, in which the students learn conversation, listening, and pronunciation by using theme-based and daily life situational conversations. The learners will be introduced grammar to help them communicate effectively in real-life situations. The course will be taught using a communicative approach, in which the learners will mainly practice conversations using a variety of grammar patterns. They will also recognize and expend their vocabulary words. Textbook and handouts will be used in the class. Teaching activities include role playing, TPR, skits, simulations, etc.
